NICK GRIMSHAW Our podcast might contain the occasional mild, swear word or adult theme. NICK GRIMSHAW Hello, and welcome to Dish. I am Nick Grimshaw and to my left is someone who knows what is what when it comes to cooking. It's Angela Hartnett! (Angela laughing) **NICK GRIMSHAW** This week, Angela, who've we got? **ANGELA HARTNETT** This week we have Rylan on the show. **NICK GRIMSHAW** Yes. ANGELA HARTNETT I love, him, he's great. So, we're going to be having some burger and some beer. NICK GRIMSHAW I like those classics. Three iconic things that we enjoy. Burger, beer, Rylan! (laughter) Before we get stuck in though, we have an email... ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah. NICK GRIMSHAW ... which has been sent in and it's a good one, and it's from someone called Winky. What a great name. **ANGELA HARTNETT** Winky, Love it. NICK GRIMSHAW Winky has a question for you Ange. 'This feels like an embarrassing question, but what is the best way to cook a simple chicken breast, keeping it juicy and not squeaky when you cut it? Many thanks, Winky.' **ANGELA HARTNETT** The really best way is to keep it on the bone.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, keep – do it as a whole chicken – but if you have to, in a pan, colour up the skin really crispy. Turn it over, a little bit of butter and a touch of stock or water
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
ANGELA HARTNETTand that will sort of slightly steam it, as well as cook it and it won't be squeaky.
NICK GRIMSHAW Ooh, so you just cook it in the pan, the full chicken breast?
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAW I don't love a breast.
ANGELA HARTNETT No.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, I've got to have a thigh, me.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, oh a thigh, interesting.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hmm, I love a thigh Well thanks for your email, Winky. If you do want to email us, with any question, dish@waitrose.co.uk is the way to do it. So, we're having a burger today, I imagine because Angela Hartnett, MBE, OBE, it's not just gonna be like a regular burger this is it? How have you made this delish?
ANGELA HARTNETT So I've seasoned up the meat with a bit of Tabasco, just to give it a little bit of spice. I've also put a lovely coleslaw on the side
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
ANGELA HARTNETT but not with just mayonnaise, with – I've sort of made it a bit lighter - and then Waitrose have relaunched their Cooks' Ingredients

NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hmm.
ANGELA HARTNETT and I'm gonna this use this Gunpowder Spice Blend, which is a little load of spice that I'm gonna put on the chips. You could even probably put it in the burger mix. And I like these 'cos they have this little code thing, QR code.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm, I want a QR code on my head. (laughter) So
ANGELA HARTNETT (ringing sound)
NICK GRIMSHAWas always you can get this recipe and all the recipes on waitrose.com/dishrecipes. Dish recipes.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yes Mutley.
NICK GRIMSHAW Erm, okay let's welcome our guest, shall we? A national treasure, I feel, Rylan Clark is.
ANGELA HARTNETT Indeed.
NICK GRIMSHAW And I feel like a national treasure, usually happens of a certain age.
ANGELA HARTNETT I know he's very young to be.
NICK GRIMSHAW He's a very young national treasure isn't he, yeah. Lots to talk to Rylan about today. We want to talk about his love of Eurovision, Big Brother, the fact that he's written a book, like us
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAWthree published authors, sat around.
ANGELA HARTNETT I know.

NICK GRIMSHAW Very – it's going to be very highbrow I feel, this afternoon.
ANGELA HARTNETT I know.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah. Erm, his smile, he's already lighting up the room. I mean literally, it's powering the podcast.
ANGELA HARTNETT He is!
NICK GRIMSHAW Erm, a round of applause everybody for the wonderful Rylan Clark, everybody. (applause)
RYLAN Ah, thank you so much.
NICK GRIMSHAW Hi Rylan.
RYLAN There's always this many people in my kitchen, it's crazy.
NICK GRIMSHAW Always. Welcome Rylan.
RYLAN Thanks for having me.
NICK GRIMSHAW Hey, we're dead excited you're here and you've got some previous with Angela haven't you?
RYLAN Yeah I have got previous, but the less said about the better.
NICK GRIMSHAW Moving on.
RYLAN Yeah. No, Angela is the only woman that made me touch her fish.
(Angela laughing)
NICK GRIMSHAW Oh!
RYLAN Yes, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Wow.
RYLAN I managed to do a whole series of Masterchef not touching a fish
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hmm.
RYLAN and then I roll up to that one's restaurant and then boom, there you go, you old trout, boom.
(laughter)
So, I was like, great.
ANGELA HARTNETT You didn't eat it though did you?
RYLAN Absolutely not.
NICK GRIMSHAW Never any fish?
RYLAN No but the chefs did, they said it was alright.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah exactly.
RYLAN Yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAW Do you have a bad fish experience?
RYLAN I was once pushed on the fish counter as a child
NICK GRIMSHAW Oh.
RYLANby my brother, in a supermarket
NICK GRIMSHAW Oh no, that's bad.

RYLANand I was like face to face with hake. Have you ever seen a hake?
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NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, they're ugly.
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ANGELA HARTNETT Prawn cocktail? No?
RYLAN Only the crisps.
NICK GRIMSHAW They're the best, best version of it. (<i>laughter</i>) What's the fish where its face is like – its body is flat and then it's face is on the side?
ANGELA HARTNETT Monkfish I think.
NICK GRIMSHAW Oh, I hate that one.
RYLAN That was me Sunday, I think. Listen, I'm not one to talk about teeth, but a Hake has got more dodgy teeth than I have. (<i>laughter</i>) Awful.
NICK GRIMSHAW Angela, how was it when Rylan turned up to work in your restaurant?
ANGELA HARTNETT He was brilliant, no he was. He was comedy genius.
RYLAN I actually loved it.
ANGELA HARTNETT Comedy genius, gold.
RYLAN I did love it, I did love it, but erm, I've not returned.
(laughter)
ANGELA HARTNETT You were great.
RYLAN Nor have I had an invite! (laughter – over talk)

NICK GRIMSHAW Not been invited. Well, I love that every guest gets a call from like our research of this, and knowing like Angela, MBE, OBE, Michelin star chef, like, is going to make you a meal, and some guests are like, oh I really like you know tuna tartare served with a blah blah blah. Rylan asked for chicken nuggets. (laughter) RYLAN Yeah. **NICK GRIMSHAW** 'So what's your favourite food?' 'Chicken nuggets.' **RYLAN** Keep it real, like come on. Give me a chicken nugget and put it in a cardboard box. (laughter) **NICK GRIMSHAW** Do you ever have a chicken nugget for your tea? Like do you ever have a tea out the freezer? ANGELA HARTNETT Er, yes yeah, yeah definitely of course I do! **NICK GRIMSHAW** Do yer? ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah! Honestly look at you, you're killing me! (laughing) **NICK GRIMSHAW** You're such a liar! ANGELA HARTNETT I'm not. NICK GRIMSHAW She's like yeah, I always have a... **ANGELA HARTNETT** I don't have chicken nuggets as such. NICK GRIMSHAW Chicken nu-jay. **ANGELA HARTNETT** No my favourite of that takeaway is 6 chicken nuggets and a cheese burger. **RYLAN** Ah, double?

NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
ANGELA HARTNETT No single, I like a single.
NICK GRIMSHAW I go single.
RYLAN I've had a triple before.
NICK GRIMSHAW Have you!
(laughter)
NICK GRIMSHAW Talk to us Rylan about your palate. What is your go-to favourite tea?
RYLAN There's these like – it's not a Pot Noodle, it's a more glamorous version.
NICK GRIMSHAW Right.
RYLAN I put two of them. I put them together with like dried onions and like black
poppy seeds.
ANGELA HARTNETT Okay.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
RYLAN I know – you're not the only chef clearly.
ANGELA HARTNETT But it is a Pot Noodle bit it's not. (over talk)
NICK GRIMSHAW Angela: 'Okay'. (laughter)
RYLAN It's not a Pot Noodle, it's a different company, but a lot nicer.

ANGELA HARTNETT Okay, okay.
RYLAN It's-it's like full-on Japanese.
ANGELA HARTNETT And then you add to it, you add to it.
RYLAN Yeah, it's just easy
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLANand quick and I actually really like it.
NICK GRIMSHAW I guess you don't have much time to cook, 'cos you are so busy. And the thickness of cards to get through your career.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN I mean, that's more cards than I got for my birthday but
NICK GRIMSHAW There's a lot.
RYLAN But no, I mean my mum does ring me quite a lot 'cos she lives very close to me
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLANand she's like, 'Do you want me to do you dinner tonight?'
ANGELA HARTNETT Oh bless her.
RYLAN Yeah but – well you say that. My mum's 'dish du jour', shall we say
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

RYLANis always- I would describe is like a arrabiata penne
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ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
MON ON MOTATO NAME.
DVI AN but she then gets plain crians and corunehes them up, puts them on ten with
RYLAN but she then gets plain crisps and scrunches them up, puts them on top with cheese and then bakes it. (laughter)
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NICK GRIMSHAW Oh my god!
There entitled the goal
RYLAN Now I am not saying it's not nice because it's actually quite nice.
NTEAN NOW Fair flot saying it's not flice because it's actually quite flice.
ANCELA HARTNETT I bet it is week
ANGELA HARTNETT I bet it is, yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
RYLAN Yeah that's-that's what she usually does.
NICK GRIMSHAW But you look like you've got like the dream, cook kitchen.
RYLAN I have got a nice kitchen to cook in.
NICK GRIMSHAW Like it looks like- you could do like a cookery show in that kitchen.
RYLAN Oh yeah, I mean we should have done it at mine today.
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NICK GRIMSHAW We should of.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN We really-really should of.
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NICK GRIMSHAW Now this place is a dump.
(laughter)
RYLAN But the reason why it looks like that is 'cos I don't cook in it that often!
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah!
RYLAN I'm just like, where's the Peroni fridge?
ANGELA HARTNETT It's pristine.
RYLAN Yeah, literally.
NICK GRIMSHAW Pristine. Did you see the animal Rylan had in his kitchen?
ANGELA HARTNETT No! What animal? Tell me.
NICK GRIMSHAW Are you ready for this?
ANGELA HARTNETT I am.
RYLAN So I'm walking around on a Sunday night
ANGELA HARTNETT Hold on, this is in Brentwood, yeah?
RYLAN This is in Brentwood, in England, in this country.
NICK GRIMSHAW In the UK, yes.
RYLAN Right?
ANGELA HARTNETT Yes okay.

RYLAN So I'm just walking around my kitchen, come day, go day. You know, normal.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN A pair of shorts on, loving life. And I look by the bi-folds, just to the right of me, and I see something on the floor. But you know when you think you've not seen something and you ignore it
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLANand in that split second, I was like oh, and about a millisecond later I look, there's a ***ing snake on the floor!
ANCELA HARTNETT Don't he vidioulous
ANGELA HARTNETT Don't be ridiculous
DVI AN A root
RYLAN A real
ANGELA HARTNETT In Essex?
(laughter) RYLAN In Essex! Now I know there's a lot of snakes in Brentwood but
RTLAN III ESSEX! NOW I KNOW there's a lot of Shakes in Dientwood but
ANGELA HARTNETT Yes.
ANGELA HARTNETT Tes.
RYLANan actual, full on, real live snake. It was about this long, this long, which, er, I'd say over 30 centimetres long.
ANGELA HARTNETT It wasn't a eel, no?
NICK CRIMCHAM No it's a speke
NICK GRIMSHAW No it's a snake.
RYLAN I weren't down the pie and mash shop, no!
(laughter)

ANGELA HARTNETT But, and then what did you do?
(over talk)
NICK GRIMSHAW Are you sure it wasn't an eel?
RYLAN Well, had a breakdown and went straight on Instagram. (laughter) Because I
was on my own!
ANGELA HARTNETT I love that!
ANGELA HARTHETT Flove trict:
RYLAN So I'm standing there like filming it
ANGELA HARTNETT That's what you would do.
RYLANand I'm like no but
NICK CRIMSHAW It's the only thing to do
NICK GRIMSHAW It's the only thing to do.
RYLAN No but- no but it's because I didn't want to feel on my own in this situation.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
RYLAN So I'm filming this snake going, 'Someone help me, someone help, I don't know
what to. Do I call the police, do I call the fire brigade. What do I do?'
ANGELA HARTNETT What was the advice from Instagram, do tell.
DVI ANI Wall it was very split. Helf of them
RYLAN Well it was very split. Half of them
ANGELA HARTNETT Yes! Then you had to do a survey!
RYLAN Half of them were saying, 'It's a grass snake
ANGELA HARTNETT Okay, right.
ANGLEA HAINTHETT Oray, Figure.

RYLANit's more frightened of you.' The other half were saying, 'My dad's a vet and it's gonna kill you.'
ANGELA HARTNETT Oh nice.
(laughter)
NICK GRIMSHAW Don't.
ANGELA HARTNETT That was nice.
RYLAN So I didn't know what to believe by this point. So anyway, I've then tried to shoo said snake and it was the slowest, weirdest snake
NICK GRIMSHAW Urgh!
RYLANyou'd want to come across.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN Anyway, it's then gone out of the bi-fold doors, so I'm like brilliant, but then I've shut the door
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLANbut I can't see the snake on the other side of the door.
NICK GRIMSHAW Urgh.
RYLAN So then I'm adamant, it's in the track of the bi-folds.
NICK GRIMSHAW Urgh.
The state of the s
ANGELA HARTNETT Oh yes.
ANOLLA HARTIETT OIT yes.

DVI AN Dut then I thought I'm leaked in that's it
RYLAN But then I thought, I'm locked in, that's it.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, you can't ever leave your house.
RYLAN I will never, ever live here again. So I'm like, what do I do? So, I rung the bloke that does my gardening and I was like, Josh. This is like 10 o'clock at night now on a Sunday
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN and I'm like 'Josh! There's a snake in the bi-folds, what am I gonna do!' And he's like, 'Leave it, I'll come in the morning.' Anyway, so I woke up in the morning, Josh has come round. I was basically in full PPE by this point.
(laughter)
So I'm in like a boiler suit I once wore on X Factor, like tucked into a pair of UGG boots. Like I'm like, nothing can get to me, and it was boiling as well, it was like 30, 40 degrees out. So he's opened up the bi-folds. It was like Cilla Black's 'Moment of Truth.' (<i>laughter</i>) Every bi-fold was opened one by one and then that was lifted up and then them 2 bi-folds slid, and it was like, huh that's not there. ANGELA HARTNETT Oh.
ANGELA HARMETT OIL
RYLAN And I still, to this moment, don't know where that snake is.
NICK GRIMSHAW Oh my god!
ANGELA HARTNETT And you've never- obviously never seen it again?
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RYLAN No, 'cos if I did I'd have a row with it. (<i>laughter</i>) Don't get me wrong, I get a lot of things hanging about. I've got a one legged pheasant
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT Okay.
RYLAN that I've once found on the treadmill in my gym. Could not write that. (laughter)
ANGELA HARTNETT Maybe shut your doors.
RYLAN No, do you know, I like the breeze!
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah!
(clinking sounds)
NICK GRIMSHAW Angela
ANGELA HARTNETT Yes Nicholas?
NICK GRIMSHAWI'm starving.
ANGELA HARTNETT Right I'm off, I'm off.
NICK GRIMSHAW So you-you go and do.
RYLAN Oh is she going? Is that it?
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, off she goes, into the freezer. (laughter)
RYLAN Don't try and slide
NICK GRIMSHAW Into the freezer, whack it in the microwave.
ANGELA HARTNETT Honestly, honestly.

NICK GRIMSHAW Well I did watch Angela prepare this lovely meal by hand.
RYLAN I'm really excited for this, as long as you don't like, slide like a sly trout in there I'll be alright.
ANGELA HARTNETT Oh no there's no fish in this.
NICK GRIMSHAW No secret fish. Speaking of animals, we've done snakes, we've done fish. Can we talk about the fox as well?
RYLAN Oh yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAW 'Cos you got mugged by a fox.
RYLAN Yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah. What happened?
RYLAN I don't know why you're all laughing because it could happen to you!
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NICK GRIMSHAW It's not funny. Yeah.
THOR CINIMOTATE ITS HOLIUMITY. Team.
DVI ANI Veele It was sufficient to the second secon
RYLAN Yeah. It was awful. I- I was on a night out
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
RYLANwhen I was probably about eighteen.
NICK GRIMSHAW So three years ago now.
RYLAN Yeah, literally only three years ago, thank you, you can stay. And I was so pissed at the time, and I remember I'd lost all of my friends and I was staying at my old friend's house in Romford. So, I walked back from Romford

ANGELA HARTNETT Had you been out in Hollywoods?
RYLAN It wasn't Hollywoods, it was 131 at the time
ANGELA HARTNETT Okay.
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RYLANby the. On the corner by the station Ange.
The state of the second by the state of the state of the state of the second of the state of the
ANGELA HARTNETT I know where you mean.
ANGLEA HARTNETT TRIOW WHERE YOU INCAIL.
RYLAN You know.
RTLAN TOU KNOW.
ANOELA HARTNETT Vasts
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN That's where we met, do you remember?
ANGELA HARTNETT Indeed, indeed!
RYLAN There you are. She was Romford's best pole dancer.
(laughter)
She was. We miss you Ange! So I'm strolling back, two in the morning
ANGELA HARTNETT Oh dear!
RYLANtoddling along the road, and as I've turned into my friend's road, I've got my wallet in one hand – my fake Louis, that I'd got down the market two days previous - and erm, my phone in the other hand. So, I was strolling along casually going about my-my life, and on the wall, there was like a brick wall with some flats behind it, there was a fox just perched on this wall. And I'm like right, fine.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
RYLAN You do you, but obviously you don't want to just casually stroll past the fox.

NICK GRIMSHAW No.

RYLAN So I did what anyone else would do, and you just stamp your foot don't you and go 'khh', like, 'ughh', right.

(laughter)

And you expect it to you know go 'khh' and it will just go.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.

RYLAN This fox crawled down this wall and just slowly walked towards me, and I'm like...

NICK GRIMSHAW Oh...

RYLAN ...and where I've had a drink I'm like, this ain't happening. So, I've gone 'khh' again. No it's not had it, and it's just come closer, and then it looked like it was about to jump and I've gone, 'Oh!' like that, dropped my wallet. It grabbed my wallet in its mouth and went!

(laughter)

Took my wallet! So, I'm standing there, two o'clock, three o'clock in the morning like, looking around for assistance and also trying to think, did I just make that up? But I know I didn't, it actually happened. And I'm looking around for like support, you know like an elderly woman or, you know, your bus driver, but it's three in the morning, there was no one there. So I'm like, what do I do? NICK GRIMSHAW A hundred per cent. (laughter)

RYLAN I know I was on speaker phone, I know I was on speaker phone. So yeah I got I got mugged by a fox erm, but that'll teach me for buying fake Louis.
NICK GRIMSHAW It will, it will!
ANGELA HARTNETT There you go love.
NICK GRIMSHAW They are though Thank you, Angela.
RYLAN Thanks Angela.
NICK GRIMSHAW Angela, what is this?
ANGELA HARTNETT Have you never seen one of these before?
NICK GRIMSHAW No never seen it, what is it?
ANGELA HARTNETT So we've got a burger, a lovely beef burger.
NICK GRIMSHAW Pronounced what, burger?
NICK GRIMSHAW Burger, ber-ger. And I've got some pickles, salad, tomatoes, and a lovely little er, like a mayonnaise, spicy mayonnaise.
RYLAN I'm really excited for this.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hmm.
ANGELA HARTNETT Chips and slaw.
NICK GRIMSHAW Oh my god, thanks Ange.

RYLAN When I was on erm Masterchef, before I came to your restaurant Angela
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah. Yes.
RYLANI actually made a Happy Meal.
NICK GRIMSHAW Ah!
ANGELA HARTNETT Oh did you?
RYLAN Yeah, on Masterchef.
ANGELA HARTNETT And? Well you obviously did well 'cos you got through to the semis.
RYLAN And I had to crawl I tried to find the secret recipe for that type of sauce.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hmmm.
ANGELA HARTNETT I've tried to make it, it's not the same.
RYLAN I- I've got it.
ANGELA HARTNETT How?
RYLAN I made it. I managed to badger this woman in California so much at head office
ANGELA HARTNETT Seriously?
RYLANshe ended up giving it to me.
ANGELA HARTNETT Can I have that?

RYLAN Onion powder, garlic powder, paprika. I'll tell you the rest later.
(laughter)
ANGELA HARTNETT See none of that- I haven't got any of that in there.
RYLAN Oh yeah!
ANGELA HARTNETT That's it, see it's the powder.
NICK GRIMSHAW And- and was it good?
RYLAN It was literally a Big Mac.
NICK GRIMSHAW Good sauce.
RYLAN I called it a Big Ry, for copyright reasons.
NIOK ODIMOLIAW Ve ale
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
RYLAN I don't want to go to jail. Oh, this is so nice, what's in that sauce?
TEAN I don't want to go to jail. On, this is so flice, what's in that sauce:
ANGELA HARTNETT Mayonnaise, tomato ketchup, loads of gherkins and pickles. I
think pickles are the things that make it.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hmmm.
ANGELA HARTNETT A little bit of Tabasco on there.
RYLAN I'm sorry, but this is the sort of food you want, do you know what I mean?
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah
NICK ODIMOLIAM Vank
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.

RYLAN I mean don't get me wrong. It's so nice when you go to like one of your places
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLANor a really, lovely restaurant and you have like that type of meal.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN But sometimes you just want a burger.
NICK GRIMSHAW I know I've said it a few times but I'm just gonna say it again, McDonald's.
RYLAN Yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAW I honestly think it's one of my favourite restaurants.
RYLAN I had a McDonald's truck at my mum's 70 th .
NICK GRIMSHAW I love it.
ANGELA HARTNETT Did you? I didn't know they did that.
NICK GRIMSHAW It's, 'cos it's consistent.
RYLAN They don't, but they do now.
ANGELA HARTNETT They do, wow.
NICK GRIMSHAW Hey, shall we talk about Eurovision? Did you know that Sam was gonna do as well as he did?

RYLAN So I kept saying it all week, while we were out there.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hm.
NIOR ORIMOTIAW WITH TITLE
RYLAN Everyone was like, we know he's brilliant, and like not taking anything away from Sam but, we're not gonna score high, we're UK, you know what it's like. I'm going, guys like seriously I think you need to be ready 'cos we might end up having to host this. I mean Sam's just such an incredible talent. So then when we found out that we're gonna be hosting on behalf of Ukraine, it was like 'Oh my god it's happening.'
ANGELA HARTNETT Yes I know.
RYLAN You know like that meme, when it's like, 'It's happening guys, it's happening!'
TOU KNOW like that meme, when it's like, it's happening guys, it's happening:
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
RYLAN It's like, Scott's on the phone, like 'Who do we need to row with?' like, and I'm like, I don't know! Like we're all, everyone is like having a breakdown. Then I've got Big Brother going, Big Brother's coming back (<i>unclear because of yelling and laughter</i>). It's like a gay dream!
(laughter)
Big Brother and Eurovision in one year! Get the snake! So I- so whilst I'm having the-the slight panic attack laying on the floor
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLANcan't breathe, holding my chest, this is all going on. But I mean we're just so excited
NICK GRIMSHAW Mmm.
NICK GRINGHAVV IVIIIIIII.
RYLAN because the one thing we know how to do in this country, we know how to put on a good show.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mmm.
THOR CIAMOTIAN WITHIN

ANGELA HARTNETT Have they decided where it is yet, where they're hosting it?
NICK GRIMSHAW Not- not yet.
RYLAN There's a short list, there's a short list.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN I-I
ANGELA HARTNETT Where Do you Have you got anywhere you would like it?
, , , ,
RYLAN I've worked up in Glasgow, I did Ready Steady Cook up there.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah yeah.
RYLAN And opposite BBC Glasgow you've got the Hydro, which is the arena.
TTEMY and opposite BBC claugew you ve got the riyare, which is the arena.
ANGELA HARTNETT Right yeah.
ANGELA HARTHETT Right years.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hmm.
NICK GRIMSHAW WITH HITTIN.
DVI AN Co that I think that would be the main group
RYLAN So that, I think that would be the main arena.
NICK CDIMOLIAN On the wester
NICK GRIMSHAW On the water.
RYLAN On the water.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN Then next to it you've got the Armadillo, which is the old arena.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, yeah yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
RYLAN That could be the delegation bubble.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN Then you've got all the riverfront, which is where you could put the Eurovision Village. So, I've always sat there and thought, like Glasgow
ANGELA HARTNETT You've really thought it though, haven't you! You've planned it!
RYLAN I've always thought Glasgow just seems ready to go.
KTEART Ve diways tribugint Glasgow Just seems ready to go.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN It's ten minutes to the airport and it's ten minutes to anywhere, in Glasgow.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, yeah that's true.
RYLAN So that, and from being part of like the UK delegation, there is nothing worse than when you land in a country and you've got a hour's coach journey to the arena
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, you don't want everyone arriving grumpy.
RYLAN You need it all like that.
ANGELA HARTNETT Makes sense, yeah.
RYLAN Erm, but the whole shortlist is great. Like wherever it is
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

RYLANit's gonna be amazing. I'm still campaigning for Brentwood
(laughter)
I've said, 'I'll put a marquee up in the garden!'
NICK GRIMSHAW They're not having it no.
ANGELA HARTNETT In the garden, I love it!
RYLAN 'I've got water, there's a pond!' Like, 'It'll look beautiful!'
NICK GRIMSHAW My boyfriend loves Eurovision.
NICK GRINISTIAW My Boymena loves Eurovision.
RYLAN Love it.
NICK GRIMSHAW Like mad for it.
RYLAN Bring him.
NICK GRIMSHAW And we have to go.
RYLAN It's the law.
ANGELA HARTNETT Glasgow.
NICK CRIMSHAW York You've get a hit of hurger squae on your face
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah. You've got a bit of burger sauce on your face.
ANGELA HARTNETT Oh sorry, thank you, oh bless you.
NICK GRIMSHAW No there you go.
RYLAN Oh, I thought it was highlighter. (laughter)
(over talk)
I thought, 'Go on, Angela.'

NICK GRIMSHAW 'Are you wearing Fenty?' 'No just a bit of burger sauce!'
ANGELA HARTNETT A night out with you two could just! Oh dear!
NICK GRIMSHAW But he got me into it this year.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAW He watched it and I can't remember where I was, but he watched it alone, which was really sad. And then
RYLAN That's not sad, I've done that.
NICK GRIMSHAW No but it made me feel sad, like watching Eurovision on your own.
ANGELA HARTNETT That you weren't watching it with him?
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah. But the Spanish entry this year
RYLAN Oh, Chanel!
NICK GRIMSHAW Chanel! Oh, we loved that, really-really loved that.
RYLAN I mean she Oh I've said- I've got a funny story about that! So at the final you have your accreditation at Eurovision, and it is so security conscious
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLANlike and I'm talking really security conscious.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

RYLAN So there's certain areas you're allowed in if you're a commentator, there's certain areas you're allowed in if you're the host, contestant, x, y, z.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN On the final me and Scott – it was the first time me and Scott had both stayed together for the final
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN and erm, so we're out there and we had seats, but we were like no, we've got our accreditation, so we'll just be in the bubble with everyone and all the acts and like fine. So, in the bubble, for the first time this year, there was a bar, and we were like I was like oh
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
ANGELA HARTNETT Peroni.
RYLAN I'd say I probably saw three songs
(laughter)
of this year's Eurovision at the final.
NICK GRIMSHAW Oh my god!
RYLAN So at the final I've then said to Scott, come on let's go into the arena and we'll go up to where our commentary boxes were.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hmmm.
RYLAN There was like a viewing deck
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

RYLANbut not for public, just for like the commentators.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN And I thought that will be really nice to sit there and do it
The part of the agent that this seriously most to set there are a serious
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
THE CHAMBER AT TOUR
ANGELA HARTNETT Mm.
ANGELA HARTHETT WITH
RYLAN because it's a lovely view. So we're standing up there with a drink and it was all lovely, and then the next thing I know I was like, 'Shall we go down there?' Because we could see a load of like British fans, with all the flags.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN We were like, yeah come on let's do that, so flash the accreditation. Now one place we're not allowed to go is obviously the Green Room, you know where all the sofas are
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
RYLAN where it's like, oh ten points! Well! I'm sitting there with Scott. We're sort of hanging over this barricade and there's our delegation sat there
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN like with Sam and everyone, and we're like; the results are coming in. I'm on the floor crying. Like, 'We just got another twelve points!' Scott's like, 'I don't believe it!' He's just filming me, I'm like 'aah, ahh' and I just thought, am I making this up? Like, surely this isn't happening. And I just grabbed Scott and went, 'This is a moment Scott, we should be there.' Then he went 'We should,' It was like Thelma & Louise, we took

each other's hands.

(laughter)
I ended up in a service tunnel, underneath this arena in Turin. Ended up working our way to the edge of the Green Room where this massive security guard was standing, checking everyone's accreditation
ANGELA HARTNETT Mm.
RYLANand it went, 'Kalush Orchestra are announced the winners.'
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN They're there. They have walked past to go up to the stage to get the trophy and I have just gone, and the security guard is like, 'You do not have correct accreditation.' I went, do not start with me tonight! (<i>laughter</i>) And he just looked at me and went, 'Okay', and the next thing you know we're on the sofas with everyone and then Chanel has just come and jumped on me, wrapped her legs round me, 'cos she came like 3 rd or 4 th
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
ANGELA HARTNETT Teall.
RYLAN and we're all just like crying and singing. It was I just don't know what happened. And it was only the following morning that my mum text me and said, oh I saw you at the final, I didn't think you were working on the final? I said, well I weren't.
(laughter)
And I said, why what did you see, and she went, I just saw you wrapped round Sam Ryder and Graham Norton and went, oh look there's Rylan, muscling in.
(laughter)
(sound of drink being poured)
ANGELA HARTNETT So Big Brother, when is that coming back? You're hosting?
RYLAN I have no idea. I genuinely don't. I'd tell you. I know it's back next year.
ANGELA HARTNETT ITV doing it?

RYLAN Definitely, ITV2.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN But yeah, when I found out the news that Big Brother was coming back I was actually in Barcelona
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLANon my own – don't ask – and
ANGELA HARTNETT I saw that. That's the first time you'd travelled by yourself.
RYLAN First time I'd ever done it. Yeah, my manager just said, you've got three days off and I went (takes a breath in) and I just booked a flight and went to Barcelona by myself. I've never done that in my life, but I'm glad I did.
NICK GRIMSHAW Did you like it on your own?
RYLAN I absolutely loved it.
NICK GRIMSHAW Would you do it again?
RYLAN Tomorrow.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN Literally, I would go again tomorrow on my own, I loved it.
NICK GRIMSHAW Wow.
RYLAN I didn't speak to anyone. Like, you know like over here if someone like looks at you
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

RYLANyou have to smile. Like I bogged out an old lady.
(laughter)
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
RYLAN Like it was, it just so nice, I got on a train. I know this sounds really mundane but like for me that was really exciting.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah you loved it.
ANGELA HARTNETT No but for someone who works as hard as you do
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah!
ANGELA HARTNETTto actually have those three days.
RYLAN It was just so nice. I took my top off on a beach, I ran riot.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAW Oh man.
RYLAN You see I got the call when I was out there and I was like right, and I was like, what now?
ANGELA HARTNETT So hold on, when you say you got the call, they said, 'We want to talk to you about Big Brother,' or?
RYLAN No, I got the call to say, 'We're letting you know that we're announcing.' I knew it was happening
ANGELA HARTNETT Okay, yeah.
RYLANbut it was like the formal, 'We're just letting you know it's going to be tonight.'

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah okay.
RYLAN So, but yeah I mean I've wanted that show to come back since the day it finished.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN I-I've not let go of it yet
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLANbut it's a new era of Big Brother. I don't know what's gonna happen.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN I know Emma's said that she's not coming back.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN I don't know if it will be any of us that used to be there. So I, I've made no secret, and I'm still not going to make a secret, of course I'd love to go back. It was such a big part of my life.
NICK GRIMSHAW I love it. I'm so happy it's coming back.
RYLAN It's just so It's just the original.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah and was so-so good and I-I really hope that they find like the right people for it
RYLAN That's all I want.
NICK GRIMSHAW'cos remember when it was so good was because people weren't

aware
RYLAN You want like Mary from Manchester.
NICK GRIMSHAW Ah yeah.
RYLAN Like, and why I love the fact it's on ITV2 now is, sort of a lot of people kept saying you know, 'It's not Love Island, we don't want this.' Well ITV has got Love Island
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLANso they're not gonna put someone in the house that could go into the villa.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, yeah.
RYLAN So And whoever ends up doing it, if it's not me, I mean I hate you. But erm
ANGELA HARTNETT Are you going to tell him it's you Nick.
THE PLANT THE POOL GOING TO TON THE POOL THOM.
RYLAN It's you innit! Is it you two?
(laughter)
(113 11)
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, it's Angela and I, get used to it. It's Angela and I are doing it yeah.
RYLAN Well go, take your burger.
NICK GRIMSHAW All I hope is that they keep the theme tune. They've got to keep the theme tune, right.
ANGELA HARTNETT Mm.
RYLAN I actually listen to that.

NICK GRIMSHAW It slaps.
RYLAN I actually listen to that song.
NICK GRIMSHAW It goes off.
(laughter)
RYLAN I played it at a DJ set the other night. I am that I've got a diary room in my house.
(laughter)
NICK GRIMSHAW I do know that but
RYLAN I'm not well. I think I married a house mate. I'm divorcing one.
(laughter)
Big Brother's part of my life.
(steam sounds)
NICK GRIMSHAW Also we've got to talk about your book as well.
RYLAN You ain't got to, don't feel obliged.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah we do.
ANGELA HARTNETT No we do.
NICK GRIMSHAW We want to.
RYLAN I'm just here for the food.
NICK GRIMSHAW So you-you wrote one what eight years ago? Best seller, No. 1.
RYLAN It done alright, yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW It did alright.
RYLAN Did alright.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah. Erm I like that you're wearing glasses to let us know that you are an author
RYLAN I'm wearing glasses
NICK GRIMSHAWof the, of the 2 nd book.
RYLAN I'm, I am wearing glasses because I'm now a two-time author
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hmm.
RYLAN but also because I've woke up with a bite on my face and these ain't got no lenses in.
(laughter)
So it's just to detract.
NICK GRIMSHAW It's just to detract from the bite!
RYLAN From the bite.
ANGELA HARTNETT But you can't see the bite.
RYLAN It's on my nose.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, oh yeah a little bit yeah. But not with them. But that says author, that really says author.
RYLAN She's an author ladies and gentlemen! Not a blind dater at all.

NICK GRIMSHAW She's an author. And it's called 'Ten', so it's all about the last 10 years since what, since you found fame and
you're emilee what, emilee you reame ame una
RYLAN It's ten years. It's ten years now that I went on X Factor.
ANGELA HARTNETT Is it, ten years? Oh.
RYLAN Ten years, an actual decade.
NICK GRIMSHAW Do you remember the exact date when you did the iconic on the couch?

RYLAN Do you know what happened there though?
NICK GRIMSHAW What!
RYLAN Because everyone Obviously you see like a very small clip – well it wasn't a small clip.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
ANGELA HARTNETT You weren't judging when he was on?
NICK GRIMSHAW No, I just remember watching this.
RYLAN The day before we'd all done our performances. So were like right we can relax now. We find out tomorrow if we're going through, none of us have got to sing anymore, let's just do it. Caroline, god rest her soul, one of the loveliest women ever, is like, 'Come on let's have a drink.' 7 o'clock in the morning the producers had woken up, found out we were still up and said 'You need to sleep because the result is in two hours.'
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

RYLAN So we're like 'Oh, alright...'. Collapse, gone. Next thing, you've got fifteen minutes to get out of bed, get ready and go to this result. It was 50 degrees, my make-up was sliding off (laughter), just down me and by this point I am ready to either kill or be killed. ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah. **RYLAN** And I'm like, just get me on a plane. Get me home. **ANGELA HARTNETT** Get me out of here, yeah. RYLAN I don't care now if I'm going on X Factor or not. Just go home. So, I turn up outside the door, waiting to go in, you see Dermot and stuff like and then I bumped into Caroline and she was obviously worse for wear as well. And I just went, 'Babes, just do me a favour. Just, if I'm not going through just tell me now, just like...' And she went... Just shook her head as if to say, you're not going through. ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah yeah yeah. RYLAN And I was like, thanks babe. And I was like, let's just get this out the way and then I can get changed. **ANGELA HARTNETT** Yeah yeah. **RYLAN** ...and just hopefully not die on a plane. (laughter) So, I go in and it's a bit like this. You have a crew there... ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah. **RYLAN** ...and stuff like that. And I'm sitting down like, you alright, you know trying to be all humble, like, oh I've had a lovely experience, you know. ANGELA HARTNETT Love you!

RYLAN Thanks for the holiday. And then she obviously said like, you're going through- I genuinely didn't know she'd said it
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN Because obviously I'd seen Cazza
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLANand knew I wasn't and I was like, what? And the- the hangover just took It was like I was possessed by the bottle of Absolut I'd just been drinking. (laughter) And it just – it was like I was out of my own body, and apparently- I don't really remember any of this. But apparently it went on for like twenty-five minutes. There was a medic. (laughter) I then came out and hit Dermot, because I was like, 'You looked at me funny as if to say no!' and it was just I was crying in Scherzinger's, physical vaginal area for-
(laughter)
It's so weird because my only memory of it is what everyone else sees.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, yeah.
RYLAN But yeah, that was ten years ago.
NICK GRIMSHAW Oh my god, wow!
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, look where you are now!
NICK GRIMSHAW What a moment! (applause) Come on! Oh my god, I can't wait to read this book because it's the ten years after that.
RYLAN I was twenty-three on X Factor, so I was young.
TY LATE I Was twellty-tilled on A Lactor, so I was young.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
MOR GRINISHAVV WIIII.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah. **RYLAN** So it's about growing up in this industry I suppose, and yeah it was really difficult. I found it really, really difficult, especially obviously the chapter on last year with obviously my break-up and things like that. NICK GRIMSHAW Mm. **RYLAN** But, yeah it was... NICK GRIMSHAW How- what was the hardest bit for you when you had to sit and actually write it? RYLAN That bit. **NICK GRIMSHAW** That was the toughest bit? RYLAN That bit, because I had - I had to make a choice, and the choice I had to make was, do I be too honest... NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hmm. RYLAN ...or do I be honest but respectful? Does anyone deserve respect? Like all of these things and I wrote the first chapter, that chapter is called '2021', and I wrote that first chapter in 6 different variations. One that's very calm, and then on the other end, one that's everything, where I've just gone, yeah blah blah, and have let everything out, and I think I've found more the calm end – thank you lawyers! (laughter) Erm, there's a lot in that first chapter that I know what's gonna happen when the book comes out. It will be this headline and that headline... ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah. **RYLAN** ...which I'm not looking forward to, but I understand that's what books do. But at the same time I think when people read it they'll be like, there's clearly a lot he's held back on here, and I hope that people respect me.

ANGELA HARTNETT What I love is at the end of each chapter you've got all the things you learnt.
RYLAN The lessons I've learned yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
ANGELA HARTNETT I mean I just thought some I mean I literally said, that's great I might use that word. You know but some of them are (over talk)
NICK GRIMSHAW Might copy that, yeah.
ANGELA HARTNETT No genuinely, very you know! (laughter) No but I think they're quite thought provoking. (over talk)
RYLAN And it is, it's like because once
ANGELA HARTNETT I think you'll surprise people with that.
RYLAN One thing that I had the idea of with the book, and it was- I was like, oh god I want to put some more in this but I don't know what. Where I did the lessons we've learnt together.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN So I took like six or seven people, like my mum's one, Claire from Steps.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
RYLAN Bernice, my make-up artist, my manager, my sister-in-law. Erm, just asked them to write a lesson we'd learnt together.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah of course.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.

RYLAN And I never read the letters
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN'cos I didn't want to. It's the only thing that I didn't read in the book. So, they've all written them themselves and then I got the final draft through, and I remember reading Claire's, and I just started crying because when I was very, very illand I don't think people realize how I ill I was last year- but when I was very ill my mum had got Claire to come and see me. I didn't want to see anyone. And she wrote in her letter – and it actually makes me get emotional now just thinking about it, 'cos I did not know this. But she said, when I left the house I had to pull over in a lay-by and I just broke down crying because I didn't think I was going to see him again.
ANOELA HADINETT V
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
DVI AN Decours thete how had I was lost year
RYLAN Because that's how bad I was last year.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
ANGELA HARTNETT Team.
RYLAN Like I was so ill and it's like you don't realise what's going on in other people's
ANGELA HARTNETT Mm.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, well I can't wait to read the rest of it.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAW I have read the first chapter and it's so-so brilliant.
ANGELA HARTNETT It's an addictive read.
NICK GRIMSHAW It really-really is an addictive read.

RYLAN Thank you.
NICK GRIMSHAW And mine says in red letters across all the way 'EMBARGOED EMBARGOED.'
ANGELA HARTNETT Yes exactly!
NICK GRIMSHAW Which is actually quite annoying, so I can't wait to actually buy a, buy a real life copy.
ANGELA HARTNETT It's true actually!
NICK GRIMSHAW So yeah.
RYLAN Well it's only this morning that I woke up and erm I started getting like messages from people, like journalists
ANGELA HARTNETT Oh!
RYLANand things like that going, I've just finished your book.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN It feels so weird to know that there's people out there that have read it.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
RYLAN So people know.
NICK GRIMSHAW Who did you- did you give it to anyone to read it first? Like your mum or any of your friends?

RYLAN No one.
NICK GRIMSHAW No, no one.
ANGELA HARTNETT Wow!
NICK GRIMSHAW No.
RYLAN No one, I didn't want anyone to know.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN I did that with my last book as well. I didn't want anyone to know.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah 'cos you don't want like feedback that makes you think about it.
ANGELA HARTNETT Question it.
RYLAN No because- because everything is my memory.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah exactly.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN It's a bit like Did you ever see The Affair?
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, yeah.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN So it's a bit like My memory might slightly differ from yours. I might think you were in a red dress but actually you were in a green dress.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.
RYLAN But it's my memory.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
RYLAN It's not your memory, so I don't need you to tell me, no I was wearing a red dress that night. So that's what I wanted to put across. This is what I remember.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.
RYLAN And this is what I know that happened. You might have been wearing a red dress and yes you pulled up a picture and you were wearing a red dress, but I'm still gonna say you were in a green dress.
ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, sure.
NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.

(applause)
NICK GRIMSHAW Thank you Rylan.
ALL Kiss kiss kiss kiss kiss kiss!
(laughter)
(kissing)
ALL Ah!
