

DISH - Vogue and Spencer with lamb and cheesy hasselback potatoes

NICK GRIMSHAW Hello, and welcome to this week's episode of DISH from Waitrose. I'm Nick Grimshaw and oh my god look, Angela HARTNETT.
ANGELA HARTNETT Hello Nicholas!
NICK GRIMSHAW Er Angela, what do we do every week on this podcast?
ANGELA HARTNETT Well, every week we have a famous face come round, I do some cooking. You do a bit of chatting, we have a drink.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.
ANGELA HARTNETT We have fun.
NICK GRIMSHAW We do some sitting and eating. Erm mainly though we make a fantastic meal. A meal you can try yourself at waitrose.com/dishrecipes
ANGELA HARTNETT Dish recipes.
NICK GRIMSHAW Dish recipes.
<i>(little break)</i>
NICK GRIMSHAW And what are we having today Angela?
ANGELA HARTNETT Er, we're gonna have roasted lamb chops...
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hm.
ANGELA HARTNETT ...with a bean, celery and red onion salad.
NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT And we've got these amazing cheesy potatoes.

NICK GRIMSHAW Oh yeah we're doing the cheesy Hasselback potatoes.

ANGELA HARTNETT Indeed yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW So I saw this recipe. This has come from the erm, Create Not Hate campaign...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW ...which is a great campaign, which helps young people get into like the creative fields...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW ...erm, and this potato, the creator of the potato is actually with us. Not of the potato, but of this recipe. Zaina is here! Hurray!

ANGELA HARTNETT Woah! (*applause*)

NICK GRIMSHAW So you can't mess this up...

ANGELA HARTNETT Thank you, thank you.

NICK GRIMSHAW ...because Zaina is here to watch the potato.

ANGELA HARTNETT And judge me.

NICK GRIMSHAW And judge the potato.

ANGELA HARTNETT Well now I've got 2 versions. We've got a vegetarian version...

NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT ..and then we've basically got a lovely one with pancetta, but they're cheesy potatoes that's well nice.

NICK GRIMSHAW Ah, what can go wrong with that – cheese and potatoes.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah nothing.

NICK GRIMSHAW Two of my faves.

ANGELA HARTNETT It's gonna taste delicious.

NICK GRIMSHAW I'm ready. Well, joining us to have these cheesy potatoes today, er we have 2 stars...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW ...that risked life and limb on a reality tv show, but walked away fallen in love with each other.

ANGELA HARTNETT Oh.

NICK GRIMSHAW Ah. Er, They're now married, they have 3 kids. One of the children is here, erm and I said to the dad - Spencer. I said, how old is the little baby and he went, 3 months, and then the mum –Vogue – said, he's 2 months.

(laughter)

So already funny. They have several podcasts. They have a stuffed lobster in their basement. They've got it all going on. Er we have Spencer Matthews and Vogue Williams!

(applause)

NICK GRIMSHAW Hi guys. Welcome to our kitchen.

VOGUE Hi, thank you very much.

NICK GRIMSHAW Spencer, you have brought us some of your gin.

SPENCER I have, I have.

NICK GRIMSHAW Tell us all about this.

SPENCER Erm, that's CleanG, our gin alternative...

NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hm.

SPENCER ...non-alcoholic gin, made with Bulgarian juniper and cardamom and-and coriander and all kinds of flavours that you would ordinarily find in a full strength gin, er without the alcohol. So you can drink it, kind of exactly as you would drink gin ordinarily. It's a one for one replacement, er and for people...

ANGELA HARTNETT And why from Bulgaria?

SPENCER Just that's apparently a fabulous place for juniper.

ANGELA HARTNETT For the juniper, okay...

SPENCER Yeah yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT Okay, fab.

SPENCER ...and so-so yeah, essentially for people who drink less, or not at all like myself...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER ...er you can still have that kind of nice, ritualistic cocktail hour.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT And with the tonic water you think it's a drink anyway.

Psychologically in a way.

(over talk)

SPENCER Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW And I think as well, like I've done months before ... *(over talk)*

NICK GRIMSHAW ...where I've not drank...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW ...and you still want, at the end of the day, like a drink that's not your daytime drink.

SPENCER Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW So I'd do like a Clean Gin...

SPENCER Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW ...or have sort of like an apple cider vinegar and fizzy water.

ANGELA HARTNETT Nice, yeah nice.

SPENCER Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Just something that was like...

SPENCER Yeah yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW ...not what you drink in the day.

SPENCER I think with, like you know when I gave up drinking it was erm, you still feel like being social...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER ...and having that experience of mixing a cocktail perhaps.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER ...or having a beer and now you can have non-alcoholic beer.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER So it's just the same thing for spirit's. Erm, I bought you some rum and tequila, as well.

ANGELA HARTNETT Fabulous.

VOGUE The tequila is very good. I drink that only because I die of hangovers...

NICK GRIMSHAW Yes.

VOGUE ...so I kind of do 1 full strength, 1 clean.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Oh that's a good idea.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Drinking clean in between. (*over talk*)

VOGUE 'Cos my mum always... Yeah, my mum always said, drink a glass of water in between.

ANGELA HARTNETT Exactly.

VOGUE Found that a little bit boring, so then I swapped (*laughter*) that for Clean T

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Sometimes I think that water - don't take this advice. Sometimes I think the water in between each drink gives me more of a hangover.

(over talk)

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW I think the alcohol aspect... *(over talk – unclear)*

ANGELA HARTNETT Right, let's get you sat down.

VOGUE One for one!

(laughter) (background noise)

NICK GRIMSHAW Guys, we are obsessed at the fact that you guys met on The Jump. I never knew this...

VOGUE Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW ...in all my years of consuming Spencer and Vogue content. *(laughter)* I didn't know that's where you actually met.

VOGUE Yeah, on The Jump.

SPENCER One of the greatest days of my life. *(laughter)*

VOGUE Well, well...

ANGELA HARTNETT Who was best on The Jump?

VOGUE I, well I would have won.

SPENCER Well it's hard to overlook the fact that I won.

ANGELA HARTNETT Oh did you, sorry. I didn't read that bit in my research. (*over talk*)

SPENCER Yeah, so, Vogue, Vogue, Vogue didn't make it er, even to the competition. I think you were out before we started, with a knee injury to be fair yeah.

VOGUE Oh yeah, I did my knee in.

ANGELA HARTNETT Oh that's right.

NICK GRIMSHAW Well she didn't just quit, she was injured.

VOGUE Well had I not. Yeah I had not, I tried to continue, they wouldn't let me.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

VOGUE Had I not, I would have won.

SPENCER This is, this is the kind of unfounded confidence that I have to... (*laughter*)

ANGELA HARTNETT Right yeah.

SPENCER ...that I have to live with, on a daily basis.

NICK GRIMSHAW It's what drew you to her.

SPENCER Yes exactly.

VOGUE Yeah..

ANGELA HARTNETT Excellent.

NICK GRIMSHAW But hang on, when did you actually meet, so like when you were doing training and stuff?

VOGUE We met when we were training and... Well we actually, we kind of met in Ibiza, a little bit. We weren't, we didn't meet.

SPENCER We shared a lift.

VOGUE We shared a lift.

NICK GRIMSHAW Right.

SPENCER Yeah.

VOGUE I didn't think he was that nice in the lift.

SPENCER I don't even recall the lift meeting, if I'm honest, although... (*over talk - unclear*)

VOGUE I was really drunk and I remember it.

ANGELA HARTNETT Were you a bit pickled in the lift?

VOGUE I just was a bit like...

NICK GRIMSHAW What was he like in the lift?

SPENCER Been left out in the sun for too long.

VOGUE I think he was actually... He was with a girlfriend erm and they obviously hadn't been getting on and I was like standing in the lift kind of stuck in the middle of it. I was like urgh.

SPENCER Yeah, those were, those were tough times but...

VOGUE Yeah.

SPENCER ...but hey. Life, life... *(over talk)*

NICK GRIMSHAW Those lift doors opened.

VOGUE Yeah and I ran. *(laughter)*

SPENCER Yeah. We-we, yeah we-we met at Hemel Hempstead didn't we?

VOGUE Yeah.

SPENCER We-we were supposed to be training on that, on that dry slope...

NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hm.

SPENCER ..and er, and-and yeah I think we... I announced on the first day that we would get married.

VOGUE Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Really?

SPENCER I think I-I was kind of joking at the time, although...

VOGUE He was joking.

SPENCER ...although, was right in the end.

VOGUE Yeah.

SPENCER As-as usual, yeah. (*laughter*)

ANGELA HARTNETT And how long have you both been married now?

VOGUE 4 years.

SPENCER 4 years, 4 and a bit yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT 4 years, 3 kids, crikey.

SPENCER Yeah.

VOGUE I know.

NICK GRIMSHAW And one of your little babies is here today with us.

VOGUE Yes, Otto comes everywhere.

SPENCER Vogue's favourite thing to do is she'll put, er put Otto down, like on the sofa kind of next to me...

ANGELA HARTNETT Mm.

SPENCER ...and she'll run doff and she'll be like, can you just keep an eye on him. It's like, well he's not going anywhere, you know what I mean. (*laughter*) I could also leave and come back and he'd still be there.

(sound of drink being poured)

NICK GRIMSHAW So we are gonna eat in a moment, but what happens in your family home? Is there one person that's the chef? Is one the sous chef? Who's in charge?

VOGUE Er, we kind of... I know why you cooked... I know why you did that now, 'cos we were coming here today.

SPENCER Sorry?

VOGUE I said to him yesterday...

SPENCER It's just nonsense!

VOGUE I said to him yesterday, I said do you know what, you never really cook and then all of a sudden he's whipping up the steaks and I was like, ah this nice and now-now it's just hit me. It's because we're here.

SPENCER Oh that's why. *(laughter)*

NICK GRIMSHAW That's why.

(over talk)

SPENCER *(first couple of words unclear)* Yes yes...

ANGELA HARTNETT Hold on, can I just ask you. Was he performance cooking? That's what they say about a man that suddenly starts cooking.

ANGELA HARTNETT He is a good cook, I have to say he is very good.

SPENCER Well I'm not, I'm not to your great standards, but I do, I do enjoy cooking. I don't practice enough to BE HONEST.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hm.

SPENCER Masterchef was an interesting time for me and I loved it...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER ...'cos it was...

ANGELA HARTNETT You did very well on it.

VOGUE Mm.

SPENCER I came 2nd, twice. *(laughter)* ...which-which by the way is just...

ANGELA HARTNETT Are we bitter about this Spencer?

SPENCER Well the first...

ANGELA HARTNETT I feel there's something here.

SPENCER The first one was I-I you know, I think he-he was a deserving winner...

ANGELA HARTNETT Right.

SPENCER ...and consistently much better than me. Er, final dishes, not that impressive I have to say, but-but it would have been unfair had he lost, I think.

NICK GRIMSHAW Right.

SPENCER Second time, just got robbed.

ANGELA HARTNETT Right. Yeah.

VOGUE Who won? Who won the second time, yeah I forget.

NICK GRIMSHAW Who won then? Yeah.

SPENCER Craig Revel Horwood

VOGUE Oh yes.

SPENCER He used salt instead of sugar in his desert.

NICK GRIMSHAW What?!

VOGUE Yeah, it wasn't great. `

NICK GRIMSHAW And then he still won?

SPENCER Yeah. In house. In the house, yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT It wasn't salted caramel or anything. OK

SPENCER Yeah, I was, I was trained quickly.

VOGUE Who trained you?

SPENCER Erm I have a friend called James Lowe.

ANGELA HARTNETT Oh.

SPENCER Called J Lowe.

ANGELA HARTNETT I know James.

NICK GRIMSHAW J Lowe

SPENCER Er and he's, he's a....

ANGELA HARTNETT James is a very good chef.

SPENCER Well he's a very close friend er and er, he-he was with us for-for a while.

I've known him for a very long time...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah

SPENCER ...and-and he came down and made chocolate fondants until 4 in the morning...

NICK GRIMSHAW Ooh.

VOGUE Yeah he did.

ANGELA HARTNETT *(laughing)*

SPENCER ...on-on many occasions. Er and, no we-we worked really hard on it but...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER But you know again it was kind of a flash in the pan.

NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hm.

ANGELA HARTNETT Sure.

SPENCER Let's get good as quickly as possible and kind of try and, you know overload with a new skill. Which I now don't practice.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.

SPENCER To Vogue's point

NICK GRIMSHAW How was it at the time Vogue when you were living with somebody who was like, *really* wants to win Masterchef?

VOGUE Do you know what it was, yeah, *really wanted to win Masterchef*. Erm I can't

stand mess, like it really upsets me if I see any mess, and when I, when Spencer cooks you've never seen anything quite like it.

(laughter)

SPENCER She can't. Like

VOGUE It's honestly, it's-it's – no it's funny.

SPENCER What about last night?

VOGUE No Spenny, It's so bad.

SPENCER I tidied as I cooked last night, on purpose, 'cos I knew you would say that today.

(laughter)

VOGUE The counter was greasy when I was going to bed and I wasn't happy with it!

ANGELA HARTNETT Did you clean up after him or do you leave it and then make a point?

SPENCER Nonsense

VOGUE I kinda just like do the last stab at it, because it was, honestly, it was just like a war zone in there, it was terrible.

SPENCER Well so that's nice, so hang on you. So you were cooked for, which was delicious I'm sure, and then you had to wipe one of the counters. God, how irritating.

(laughter)

SPENCER Everything else was looked after though was it?

(laughter)

ANGELA HARTNETT Ah love it, I love it!

NICK GRIMSHAW: But not that! ooohhhh

VOGUE I want him to cook like his Mum. His Mum is a great cook.

NICK GRIMSHAW Right.

VOGUE And she'll come and cook a big roast. And then...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

VOGUE ...like there's nothing there to clean up.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER She makes a mean roast.

VOGUE Ah her roasts.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah I bet.

VOGUE Yeah.

SPENCER It is great though.

NICK GRIMSHAW Mums generally – not to generalize to all mothers – but the roasts do rule.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, of course.

NICK GRIMSHAW Do you think it's the practice? Every single Sunday.

ANGEL HARTNETT Yeah.

VOGUE Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW For 60 years.

ANGELA HARTNETT I think it's also the love they do it, because that's that.. It always felt like that's the one day of the week all the family is together.

VOGUE Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT And I think if you're a mother, that's your protectiveness and you want all your family,– so you're going to make a bit of an effort, I would imagine. I would think that.

VOGUE Yeah.

SPENCER What would be your preferred meat for a roast?

ANGELA HARTNETT Oh chicken, hands down.

VOGUE Really!

SPENCER Really?

ANGELA HARTNETT Oh God yeah, I love it.

VOGUE I'd never go for the chicken!

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, love chicken.

NICK GRIMSHAW We never had a chicken roast.

ANGELA HARTNETT Oh no, I love sage and onion stuffing.

VOGUE Oh yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Oh yeah.

VOGUE Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT And the other thing you know, you two have been, I mean these are really quite cheeky guests on – just putting it out there! They've already been nibbling at the food...

(laughter)

ANGELA HARTNETT ...uninvited. Fingers in there. I mean. But the great thing about chicken is you put it on a, like a, a little rack and then just towards the end you put this piece of bread underneath and all the juices...

SPENCER Yeah.

VOGUE Oh yeah.

SPENCER Fantastic.

ANGELA HARTNETT ...soak into that bread. And you know so you've got all that beautiful flavour and that crisps up.

SPENCER Fantastic.

(over talk)

VOGUE Oh yeah..

ANGELA HARTNETT Honestly, you've just not had a great roast chicken, that's why.

VOGUE That's true.

(over talk)

SPENCER Ooh. Everything you need to...

VOGUE I mean I'm a – yeah I'm a chicken in the bag, kind of person.

ANGELA HARTNETT Chicken in a bag, oh.

VOGUE Yeah.

SPENCER It's funny how you can pick stuff up though. I can't remember if it was erm Men's Health or GQ but there was a chicken recipe in it.

ANGELA HARTNETT Umm yeah.

SPENCER And we thought to ourselves, oh it would be fun just to make this.

VOGUE Oh I remember that.

SPENCER And we, and we tore it out and got all the ingredients – and we made it – and it was just fantastic.

VOGUE So good.

SPENCER You know what I mean, and it's like I imagine there's so much in your cook books that...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER ...would just be so great to make at home. I don't think we make enough effort.

VOGUE No, we don't.

SPENCER We should, we should make more effort.

NICK GRIMSHAW Tonight might be the night that you...

VOGUE No, I'm gonna stuff myself with that.

(laughter) (Overtalk)

NICK GRIMSHAW Tomorrow might be...

SPENCER We intend to leave nothing for the future guests

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah not-not tonight.

(peeling sounds)

NICK GRIMSHAW Vogue, do you ever take charge? Are you ever the one that's...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW ...like, right tonight is the night I'm gonna make something?

VOGUE I'm a... I think that I'm a basic cook, erm which like doesn't bother me. I-I like to cook. I could eat the same thing four nights in a row.

ANGELA HARTNETT Right, yeah.

VOGUE He would hate that more than anything but like...

SPENCER I can't do that.

SPENCER But like, you know, your-younger brother does this as well. Like he'll make a kind of bolognese and then just put it in the fridge and eat it, four nights in a row.

ANGELA HARTNETT Right, yeah.

SPENCER It's just that I can't like, I couldn't think of anything I'd like to do less

(over talk)

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah yeah.

VOGUE No he used to... When he first moved over from Ireland when he got his first job, he used to cook a bolognese on-on a Sunday night and he would eat for lunch and dinner 'til the Thursday...

ANGELA HARTNETT Wow.

VOGUE ...and I was, what is wrong with you?

ANGELA HARTNETT Wow.

VOGUE I was like, are you having pasta with that every time. He's like yeah.
(laughter)

SPENCER I'm fine for like economizing, right.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, yeah.

SPENCER You know figuring out your weeks and...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, of course, yeah.

SPENCER ...you kind of know what's coming. You know we're a family of five now and we've got Vogue's brother and sister with us...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, sure.

SPENCERmost of the time. So it's just kind of, if we're constantly cooking...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER ...or constantly getting deliveries. It's just, it piles up, so ...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, of course.

SPENCER We're quite organized in the way we use stuff as well, but I couldn't eat the same thing every night of the week.

ANGELA HARTNETT No.

VOGUE Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW No, you're not like filling up the bathtub with a big bolognese.

(laughter)

NICK GRIMSHAW For the seven of you there. Get in here with your straws.

(Peeling sounds)

NICK GRIMSHAW I like it when you sort of heckle one another.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, mm.

VOGUE We do that a lot.

NICK GRIMSHAW Do you ever finish recording the podcast and then like, oh it's actually kicked off a real-life row now?

VOGUE Like and I have to stop him sometimes on our podcasts – I'm like remember what your Dad says about you talking over people all the time. Don't do it anymore.

ANGELA HARTNETT *(laughing)*

VOGUE And then we might have a little fight in the middle of it and then we're back on track.

SPENCER We have had actual fights on the podcast.

VOGUE We've had...

NICK GRIMSHAW Right.

VOGUE Like we've had to re-record two in our whole time. He'll deny this, ask Imo - our producer- 'cos she's sitting there listening to the whole thing! And sometimes it gets a bit out of hand and I'm like, oh honestly, I'm not doing this anymore. I'm not recording with you!

ANGELA HARTNETT And what were you arguing about?

SPENCER Well I think we both are...

VOGUE Nothing.

SPENCER Yeah nothing, we both have jobs kind of outside podcasting obviously...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

VOGUE Yeah.

SPENCER ...and it's kind of... You know, some days when we're really under it and you've got to kind of come back from the office to record a podcast in which we're talking about, you know, Kim Kardashian's arse, you know...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, yeah.

SPENCER ...which just does me in 'cos I ...

NICK GRIMSHAW Serious stuff.

SPENCER ...I don't care.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, of course, yeah.

SPENCER You know so it's kind of like. I don't know we we'd clash over certain pod topics and me not wanting to be associated with them.

(laughing)

ANGELA HARTNETT Brilliant.

NICK GRIMSHAW So Spencer, you have – you and Jamie do the podcasts and er Vogue it's you and Joanne doing the podcasts.

VOGUE Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Do they come out on like the same day?

VOGUE No.

NICK GRIMSHAW Do you ever get rivalry of you two Like oh mine's out, mines out?

VOGUE No, we actually don't. We like, we're quite good ...

SPENCER No, there's no rivaling Vogue and Joanne's to be honest.

VOGUE No.

SPENCER It's like, it's-It's this. It's this absolute kind of power house. It's-it's bizarre. I get shouted at in the street about their podcast.

(laughing)

It's a bit like, I have nothing to do with this. It's like, I love your wife's podcast! It's like, ok.

NICK GRIMSHAW Sorry about that Spencer.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, what about me!

SPENCER Yeah, what about me!

ANGELA HARTNETT I'm the needy one in this relationship.

VOGUE Oh god!

SPENCER Yeah, no, but I think their one, I mean it's-it's, it's incredibly popular their one...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER ...and like amazingly so. It's-it's quite a powerful thing, I think, anyway.

NICK GRIMSHAW Mm hm.

VOGUE It's fun. Ours is, ours is doing quite well as well.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yes.

VOGUE And we really love, like I love sitting down and getting an hour to do that with each other.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, yeah

VOGUE It's-it's just fun to just talk about things that aren't just about the kids and just having a laugh with each other.

(gas clicking noise)

NICK GRIMSHAW Angela, that is tasty. How did you get the lamb like that?

ANGELA HARTNETT Erm, marinade it for a couple of hours beforehand...

NICK GRIMSHAW Yep.

ANGELA HARTNETT ...with anchovies, rosemary, garlic, a touch of lemon.

NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT And then roasted. Anything roasted in butter is great.

VOGUE Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT And then these little bit's, these small little bit's to the top of the lamb chop. And I took those off because they're quite fatty but then roasted them all down with the lamb, so you get it roasted in all that fat.

VOGUE That was absolutely stunning.

ANGELA HARTNETT And then they're nice and chewy and crispy.

SPENCER Is the vinaigrette erm, like white wine vinegar and rape seed oil?

ANGELA HARTNETT Er red wine vinegar, olive oil and mustard – Dijon.

SPENCER Mm.

VOGUE Yum.

SPENCER A la J Lowe, he learnt it from you. Didn't he?

(laughing)

That is so good, the celery and the red onion.

ANGELA HARNTELL Yeah.

SPENCER That is like that – with the salt and pepper and a dash of lemon?

ANGELA HARTNETT Exactly, you know it. You know it.

SPENCER Got it.

ANGELA HARTNETT You've got it.

VOGUE That's the nicest potato i've ever had and I'm Irish.

NICK GRIMSHAW Wow, wow, wow. A round of applause for that potato. *(applause)*

ANGELA HARTNETT I think we have to salute – like it's not my recipe the potato, is it?

NICK GRIMSHAW No.

ANGELA HARTNETT It's Zaina's potato.

VOGUE What a potato!

(little break)

ANGELA HARTNETT Zaina hates the way I say Waitrose.

NICK GRIMSHAW Waitrose.

ANGELA HARTNETT I say Waitrose.

NICK GRIMSHAW Waitrose!

ANGELA HARNELL Yeah.

SPENCER 'Cos you're saying it incorrectly.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah! That's why he hates it.

VOGUE We used to have a fight on our pod about it. I'd be like it's Waitrose.

ANGELA HARTNETT It's Waitrose.

NICK GRIMSHAW Waitrose – wait, rose!

NICK GRIMSHAW Speaking of Waitrose, erm, if you do want to get this recipe or any other recipes that you hear on this podcast, go to [waitrose.com/dishrecipes](https://www.waitrose.com/dishrecipes). And they're all on there.

SPENCER Fantastic.

ANGELA HARTNETT Dishrecipes

VOGUE We're – we will make this at home.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.

VOGUE Pretend it's ours, they'll never know.

SPENCER Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yep, they'll – those potatoes are delicious Angela. How did you make that so yum?

ANGELA HARTNETT It's just butter, bacon and cheese.

NICK GRIMSHAW Ah, what could go wrong.

VOGUE Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT What could go wrong.

NICK GRIMSHAW You could have cardboard with that and it would taste nice.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah! Mm.

(laughter) (plate noises)

ANGELA HARTNETT Do you eat as a family? Do you, are the kids in bed? I mean obviously the little one's sleeping but your-your other two. Are they up, you all sit down together?

VOGUE I eat at five o'clock, yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT Right.

SPENCER Vogue eats at the same time as the kids.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Lucky.

VOGUE It's just easier, otherwise I'm doubling up.

NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, yeah of course.

VOGUE When people invite me out for dinner and they're like, we're going out at 9. I'm like, oh my god I have to have a pre-dinner, dinner, I can't wait until 9.

SPENCER Nine is like the middle of the night for Vogue

VOGUE Yeah.

SPENCER Yeah.

VOGUE I can't stand it.

ANGELA HARTNETT I get that.

SPENCER When we do go out to dinner, which is, which is, which we are making more

of an effort to do actually. It's erm – like I'll often get a table somewhere at kind of 8...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER ...and Vogue thinks that's an hour and a half, like late.

VOGUE Yeah.

SPENCER Why don't we just get there at 6.30? It's like we'll be the only people there!

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.

(over talk)

ANGELA HARTNETT Mmm

VOGUE I'll have, I'll have had cheese on toast!

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah but you say that now. Everyone's eating early now

NICK GRIMSHAW Are they?

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, god, so many people and like, even like I've always eaten late and that. And now I'm like, I'll take the 6.30 table.

VOGUE Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT I want to be done, home, finish. Walk home, drink on the way home. Done.

NICK GRIMSHAW Drink on the way home!

(laughter)

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, why not?

(laughter)

NICK GRIMSHAW What, like a hip flask?

ANGELA HARTNETT No! Yeah I take a hip flask to a restaurant!

(sound of liquid being poured out)

NICK GRIMSHAW And then what about after dinner, do you like to have an expresso?

VOGUE No.

SPENCER Erm not, well.

ANGELA HARTNETT This feels like a leading question here.

SPENCER I have, I have, I have been known to have an espresso at night.

NICK GRIMSHAW An Espresso.

SPENCER A what? An Espresso.

NICK GRIMSHAW X.

SPENCER S.

(laughter)

NICK GRIMSHAW Don't you hate Espresso – I read this somewhere that you hate it.

SPENCER Well it's not that... *(over talk)*

NICK GRIMSAHW Why do people say that!

SPENCER I wasn't gonna pull you up on it.

(laughter)

NICK GRIMSHAW Yes.

(laughter)

VOGUE As soon as he said it I was like rrr.

NICK GRIMSHAW But do you know what, I was, I was doing it because I've heard...

SPENCER Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW ...because this is a-a hatred that we share.

SPENCER Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW But it's only a little thing and I don't know where it's come from.

SPENCER Yeah I don't know...

VOGUE Well I'll tell you something about espresso. *(over talk – unclear)*

SPENCER I don't know why you keep insisting on getting it wrong.

VOGUE He was so annoyed right, I don't say espresso I say espresso.

SPENCER Ok.

VOGUE And he was so annoyed by espresso, and then we went to his parent's lovely hotel in the Caribbean...

ANGELA HARTNETT Right.

VOGUE ...and on the menu was an Espresso! And he literally....

(laughing)

NICK GRIMSHAW He flipped the table!

VOGUE Mum! Who did this menu!

SPENCER Yeah, I don't recall yelling at my Mum like that. But yeah no it erm, yeah no, it is erm -for those listening - it is Espresso – there's, there's no X – and there never has been an X and there probably never will be an X. So, I would have thought just read it as it is!

(laughing)

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.

SPENCER It is, it is a common mistake though to be fair.

NICK GRIMSHAW It is.

SPENCER It's, it's on a par, in my opinion with en route.

VOGUE En route.

SPENCER With en route, yeah. En route.

NICK GRIMSHAW Oh my god.

VOGUE O N, it's like oh my god.

SPENCER Yeah, in fact like if I, if I'm new to someone and like...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER ...we're meeting maybe for the first time, particularly, *(over talk – unclear)* particularly if it's business related...

ANGELA HARTNETT Right.

SPENCER ...and they're like, oh yeah I'm on route – with an O – I'm just like argh just, I don't know if I can...

ANGELA HARTNETT No you're not!

SPENCER I don't, I don't know if we can do this anymore.

NICK GRIMSHAW That's not a phrase.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, cancel the meeting.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

(laughter)

SPENCER Just like, I have, I have developed...

VOGUE Yeah, yeah, yeah.

SPENCER ... a-a a negative opinion of you.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW One of my pet hates that people say is, when they say, when they're spelling with 'h' and they say haitch!

SPENCER Yeah, haitch, yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW I'm like *(unclear)*...

ANGELA HARTNETT Aitch.

SPENCER Aitch – like the rapper.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah like the rapper.

SPENCER Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT Oh yes, yes, yes, yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW So it's haitch A T. I'm like, no you don't haaaa

VOGUE Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT Aitch.

(sound of pouring liquid)

SPENCER When you order a pizza...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER ...and it arrives, do you, do you elevate it? We spend an awful lot of time ...

ANGELA HARTNETT No.

SPENCER ... like we go to town on it.

ANGELA HARTNETT No!

SPENCER Oh.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah yeah, DIY it.

VOGUE Yeah, yeah.

(over talk)

SPENCER I'll often order a pizza, a thin crust pizza from – well from a delicious restaurant called Melanzana

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER ...and it, and it arrives and I'll often have...

VOGUE It arrives within like 10 minutes.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER ... a hot pan. A hot pan on the go...

ANGELA HARTNETT Okay.

SPENCER And I put the pizza in the hot pan.

ANGELA HARTNETT So you're fully prepared for this?

SPENCER Yeah, yeah.

VOGUE Yeah.

SPENCER And it will, it will like crisp up.

NICK GRIMSHAW Mm.

ANGELA HARTNETT That's a good tip. Yeah.

SPENCER And it's fantastic.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER It becomes like really crunchy and like - so it probably goes like – crtch –

you know delicious and then salt, loads of pepper.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER Some oregano. You know just lots of herbs.

VOGUE Oregano?

SPENCER Yeah, yeah I do.

VOGUE Oregano, oregano.

(over talk) unclear...

NICK GRIMSHAW Oregano!

(laughter)

ANGELA HARTNETT But what pizza have you bought? Just a simple one or what are we tarting up?

SPENCER Oh no just like, like a standard, like buffalo mozzarella, cherry tomatoes classic pizza.

ANGELA HARTNETT Right, ok right.

SPENCER No nonsense on there.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

SPENCER Yeah. And then just like chili flakes, maybe some chili oil, maybe even a bit of pesto.

VOGUE Balsamic vinegar.

SPENCER Hummus for the crusts.

NICK GRIMSHAW Oh yeah I love the hummus on the crusts.

ANGELA HARTNETT Hummus on a crust!

SPENCER Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT What is that?

SPENCER If you saw the pizza when it arrived and when it gets to the table, different thing.

VOGUE Different, yeah.

(Wine pouring)

NICK GRIMSHAW Vogue now I wanted to talk to you about construction.

VOGUE Yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW I never knew that before modelling you worked – and I don't know why I find this so funny but I do! You worked on a building site!

(laughing)

VOGUE For 6 months I worked with a construction company!

ANGELA HARTNETT Excellent.

VOGUE No I did two-two construction degrees. Er, couldn't get enough of it.

NICK GRIMSHAW Oh.

VOGUE And thank god - well not thank god. Thankfully for me, the building industry collapsed so I didn't have to go forth with my career.

NICK GRIMSHAW Okay.

ANGELA HARTNETT Right okay.

VOGUE Coz my Step-dad was ..

NICK GRIMSHAW So like, with like a hammer and that?

VOGUE No I was a Site Engineer.

NICK GRIMSHAW Oh ok.

VOGUE So I actually was like, I-I used to give the safety demonstrations. I also...

SPENCER Give us, give us a demo, go on.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah go on give us a demo.

VOGUE I can't even remember what it was

NICK GRIMSHAW What are the risks in here?

VOGUE Well because I was the only girl I had to kind of really like have a bit of authority and like someone...

ANICKA HARTNETT Yeah.

VOGUE ... wasn't wearing their hard hat I'd be – go to the office! Go to the office!
Just like a little witch.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

VOGUE Going around and giving out to people. They used to bribe me obviously because I didn't want to, it was freezing.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

VOGUE Er, and they'd be like, you can choose your own steel cap boots if you go outside onto the site and I'm like, ok go out and I'd choose my own boots.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

VOGUE Erm have my own hard hat. I actually really liked it, I liked the people I worked with. I-I find erm architecture and bridges, in particular, very interesting. So...

NICK GRIMSHAW I do love a bridge.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

VOGUE I love a bridge!

NICK GRIMSHAW I love a, I love a programme on a bridge.

VOGUE Ah!

NICK GRIMSHAW Did you watch – The Bridge – on Channel 4?

SPENCER Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

VOGUE Did we watch that one?

NICK GRIMSHAW Where they, with two teams...

SPENCER Well we're not the same person darling.

(laughing)

SPENCER I have watched The Bridge, yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW Where two teams have to build a bridge.

VOGUE Did you?

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

VOGUE No I've never watched that.

NICK GRIMSHAW And then the money was on the island and they had to build a bridge. It was really good.

VOGUE Oh I'd be into that.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.

SPENCER You're into bridges and money, so that would be a good one.

(laughing)

NICK GRIMSHAW It's you all over. Yeah.

SPENCER Yeah yeah.

VOGUE I think I'd – yeah I do find them fascinating but er, no I loved it and I was gonna go, I actually was meant to go to Qatar...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

VOGUE ...because there was no jobs over here, how random. Erm and er, and then my stepdad was like – actually you can go and try and do what you really want to do, and that's kind of how it came about.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah. Fantastic.

SPENCER What were you gonna do in Qatar?

VOGUE I was going to be a Quantity Surveyor. Yes.

SPENCER Oh right.

NICK GRIMSHAW She was going to survey.

VOGUE Yes, yeah.

SPENCER And we would have never met.

VOGUE No, I would have been absolutely roasting over in Qatar.

ANGELA HARTNETT *(laughing)*

NICK GRIMSHAW Angela, that was a really, really tasty dinner.

ANGELA HARTNETT Thank you very much. Thank you.

VOGUE Level of difficulty to make that?

ANGELA HARTNETT No difficulty, easy.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah but says the chef.

ANGELA HARTNETT If he's been on Masterchef.

VOGUE Yeah yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT Sorry, he, sorry, excuse me, it's rude, it's rude.

ANGELA HARTNETT Spencer's been on Masterchef, you'll be able to do that, easy. All of us can.

SPENCER It would be great, it would be great to get one, the recipes from Waitrose.com

VOGUE Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah that's right, forward slash Dishrecipes.

ANGELA HARTNETT Thank you very much. Loving that, loving it.

NICK GRIMSHAW Dish recipes. And now to end today we thought we could do a little quiz with you guys.

VOGUE Okay.

NICK GRIMSHAW I sense the competition. So erm! It should be very interesting. We're gonna do Mr. and Mrs. with you guys.

SPENCER Excellent.

VOGUE Ok.

NICK GRIMSHAW Erm, so let's go first of all with Vogue.

VOGUE Okay.

NICK GRIMSHAW Who is Spencer's celebrity crush?

VOGUE Now, I would have said Arianna Grande but he went off her.

NICK GRIMSHAW Right.

ANGELA HARTNETT Oh.

VOGUE So, oh God you haven't mentioned anyone recently.

SPENCER Yeah, like I, I'm not.

VOGUE Jeff Bezos. Jeff Bezos.

(laughing)

SPENCER Chris-Chris... I like, I like a bit of Chris Hemsworth

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah Chris.

VOGUE Elon Musk

(over talk)

SPENCER I'm not, I'm not just trying to sound like a great husband or whatever. I don't, I don't really fancy any, like I don't fancy any women at the moment.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah. Ok.

VOGUE At the moment, at the moment.

SPENCER No but like, if I look at celebrities I don't like... I don't find myself fancying, like any female celebrities.

NICK GRIMSHAW Right.

SPENCER At the moment.

ANGELA HARTNETT Good answer.

SPENCER Although, although Thor is high end. He is alright.

VOGUE Yeah yeah yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah he's all right.

SPENCER We like him.

NICK GRIMSHAW So Thor.

SPENCER Yeah, yeah. Chris Hemsworth

NICK GRIMSHAW Thor it is, ok. Okay.

VOGUE I don't fancy Thor.

SPENCER That's not for you. Yours is Skepta

VOGUE No I thought it was, no.

SPENCER ...which is fantastic because obviously I'm so similar to to Skepta

(laughter)

You can see the similarities.

NICK GRIMSHAW I think if you do want a crush they should be far away from your actual partner.

NICK GRIMSHAW + ANGELA HARTNETT Yes.

NICK GRIMSHAW So Vogue, you having Skepta and Spencer you having Chris Hemsworth.

VOGUE Well it's not Skepta yet, I told you, I've changed.

(laughter)

SPENCER Who is it now, Dave?

VOGUE Dave, Dave, Dave.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yes ok Dave – great teeth has Dave

VOGUE Great teeth.

NICK GRIMSHAW Great teeth, great teeth. Erm, ok Spencer, what would you say is Vogue's prized possession?

SPENCER Her dog, Winston.

VOGUE Oh that wasn't it, I was thinking my phone!

(laughing)

SPENCER Your phone.

VOGUE I'm going to hell!

(laughter)

ANGELA HARTNETT No children, no husband.

SPENCER Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah

SPENCER Well, our children, our children I'd like to think aren't possessions.

VOGUE I do yeah, yeah, yeah.

SPENCER Although I did, I did go to them first.

NICK GRIMSHAW Ok.

SPENCER You like, you like your rings as well. You like your new rings.

VOGUE I do, I do.

SPENCER If we're going material you like your rings.

VOGUE Yeah, yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT Okay alright.

NICK GRIMSHAW Okay, not the dog, the phone.

SPENCER No.

VOGUE I really love my phone!

NICK GRIMSHAW I love my phone!

(Crackling noise)

SPENCER How about we ask you some Mr. and Mrs. questions.

NICK GRIMSHAW Ok well we are married. Famously married.

VOGUE Ok Angela...

ANGELA HARTNETT Yes.

VOGUE ...you seem more spicier of the two – so, what is Nick's most annoying habit?

ANGELA HARTNETT Annoying habit?

VOGUE Yes.

ANGELA HARTNETT Oh, oh god, that's a bit mean to ask me that.

NICK GRIMSHAW No, come on be honest.

ANGELA HARTNETT If I was with, living with Nick, it would be the fact that he's on his phone all the time.

NICK GRIMSHAW I would.

SPENCER They sound so similar these two.

VOGUE We are the same person.

(over talk)

NICK GRIMSHAW I would say my phone is, I, it's so bad. I just love it.

ANGELA HARTNETT I mean we've done interviews, literally like on Radio 4, we're being interviewed and the question was directed at me. And I'm looking at him and he's on his phone. And then he looks up and he goes – Yeah they were great. Like – I mean I'll give him credit he can multitask.

VOGUE Yeah.

NICK GRIMSHAW I can multitask.

ANGELA HARTNETT He can multitask.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.

ANGELA HARTNETT You know because not my husband when he's on his phone. Like I'll go, oh text my sister, and then he'll see something on his phone and I'll go, have you done that? And he goes, what? And I go, I said to text You know he'll get distracted, but fair play to Nick you don't get distracted.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, I would say my most annoying thing is being on my phone, I'd agree.

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah, I'd say Mesh would say that

VOGUE What's your screen time?

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, it's, it's bad.

ANGELA HARTNETT It's triple figures.

VOGUE I'm sure.

NICK GRIMSHAW No, it's only like 7 and something hours.

VOGUE Me too!

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, yeah. Is that a week?

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah.

VOGUE How do I have time for that!

ANGELA HARTNETT How the hell do you have time? Is that a day?

VOGUE It's a day.

ANGELA HARTNETT Oh a day.

VOGUE It's a day.

(laughter)

ANGELA HARTNETT You can set a date! That is not....

SPENCER What are you on, 8 hours a day?

VOGUE 7.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah, I thought that was the week, an hour a day

VOGUE – ANGELA HARTNETT No!

ANGELA HARTNETT I think we have a problem.

SPENCER What, an hour a day? An hour a day would be pretty good.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.

VOGUE I don't believe it to be honest with you. I think somebody is...

NICK GRIMSHAW Is making that up.

SPENCER You, you clocked up 14 didn't you in a day?

VOGUE No I did not. No I did not.

SPENCER Yeah you did.

VOGUE Well how would I manage 7 with 3 kids, it's beyond me, I don't know.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah.

SPENCER I have a question for you Nick.

NICK GRIMSHAW Okay.

SPENCER What is Angela's favourite thing on toast?

ANGELA HARTNETT Trying to think what I think it is.

VOGUE Oh.

NICK GRIMSHAW Ooh, now when we first met to have a date about doing a podcast together, I... We, we were asked a question, – what's the best thing on toast. And I gave my answer and Angela said, that's a stupid question, everything's good on toast.

ANGELA HARTNETT *(laughing)*

NICK GRIMSHAW Which is true but what is your favourite thing on toast?

SPENCER Makes this even trickier.

ANGELA HARTNETT I'm trying to think now.

NICK GRIMSHAW I think you'd either like something cheffy – like some sort of sardine or something.

VOGUE Oh no.

NICK GRIMSHAW Or maybe you just have butter and salt.

(laughter)

VOGUE Ah that's delish!

NICK GRIMSHAW Like, that's also quite cheffy isn't it. Like the bread speak for itself.

VOGUE Yeah, yeah with butter dripping off.

NICK GRIMSHAW Yeah I'd say butter.

ANGELA HARTNETT I think butter, yeah. That probably is my favourite thing on toast. And I do like it with a bit of Bovril on top of the butter.

VOGUE Urgh.

SPENCER Oooh. Bovril is just divine

ANGELA HARTNETT Yeah Bovril.

(laughter)

ANGELA HARTNETT It is!

SPENCER Fantastic.

ANGELA HARTNETT Honestly you are a great guest when it comes to food.

SPENCER Thank you.

ANGELA HARTNETT You've got a very...

SPENCER I love food.

ANGELA HARTNETT You could be a food critic.

SPENCER I love food.

NICK GRIMSHAW That is just divine.

ANGELA HARTNETT You should be the voice of Marks & Spencer...

(laughing)

Oh I shouldn't say that!

(laughter)

NICK GRIMSHAW Or Waitrose yeah.

SPENCER Yeah or Waitrose!

ANGELA HARTNETT I'm so sorry, I don't know where...
Oh my god! Do you know what I mean though.

VOGUE Oh my God.

SPENCER Why don't you say you should be the voice of Waitrose and then we can have a...

(laughter)

NICK GRIMSHAW Vogue and Spencer, thank you so much for joining us for dinner.

ANGELA HARTNETT Thank you yeah.

VOGUE Thank you for having us.

NICK GRIMSHAW And a round of applause for Spencer and Vogue everybody. Woah!

(applause)

That was very fun.
